Oliver Cromwell rose from relatively humble origins to become a successful political and military leader during the English civil war between the royalists (the king and his supporters) and parliament in the 1640s. After defeating Charles II in 1651, Oliver Cromwell ruled England, Scotland and Ireland as Lord Protector from 1653 to 1658.

The iconic title page of the Great Bible is often seen as the emblem of the English Reformation. It shows Henry handing copies of the Bible to Cromwell and to Thomas Cranmer, the Archbishop of Canterbury. Cranmer and a man long assumed to be Cromwell are shown distributing the book to clergymen and lay nobility.

The Reformation Parliament was formed to decide what to do and Cromwell used his influences to manipulate the commons until in 1532 they declared Henry as "the only head, sovereign lord, protector and defender" of the Church. Henry gave Cromwell more roles in the government to show his gratitude.
