Glucosamine and chondroitin sulfate, often sold as a single dietary supplement, can be taken for joint health. Oral glucosamine comes from shellfish (although vegetarian options exist) and may help rebuild cartilage.

Osteotomy on the socket side of the hip is called "acetabular osteotomy" or "pelvic osteotomy". The peri-acetabular osteotomy (PAO) is the most common procedure for young adults (click the image below to view a video of this procedure). This is also called the Ganz osteotomy because it was developed by Professor Ganz in Berne, Switzerland.
