What To Do If You're Attracted To Your Therapist ...

Respondents who reported attraction to clients were asked if sexual attraction toward clients had ever been beneficial to the therapy process. More therapists (69%) than not said that their sexual attraction had been beneficial in at least some instances, chi-square (1, N = 464) = 66.87, p <.003.

Treatment for compulsive sexual behavior typically involves psychotherapy, medications and self-help groups. A primary goal of treatment is to help you manage urges and reduce excessive behaviors while maintaining healthy sexual activities. If you have compulsive sexual behavior, you may also need treatment for another mental health condition.

Clinical work often evokes strong feelings including attraction and sexual arousal, in our patients and ourselves. It is to be expected. Often, these feelings signal important information about our patients' development and relational difficulties, and about ourselves, and the therapeutic work to be done.

Erotic transference refers to feelings of romantic love or sexual fantasies that a client experiences for their therapist. As with any difficult feelings experienced in therapy, the key to working through these feelings is talking about them; however, it can feel almost impossible to do so.

Certain diseases or health problems, such as epilepsy and dementia, may cause damage to parts of the brain that affect sexual behavior. In addition, treatment of Parkinson's disease with some dopamine agonist medications may cause compulsive sexual behavior.

In contrast, "Conversion therapy" is a general term to describe attempts to increase heterosexual attraction and decrease unwanted homosexuality with the help of a (usually unlicensed) therapist. Opponents of such therapy say it involves aversion techniques (shame, pain or coercion) in order to effect change in the client.
